

Driver's License Suspension & Restoration Notifications

Many states suspend a person's driver's license for missing court. Timely notifications can help avoid suspensions in the first place and let someone know when and how they can reinstate their license. Here are four opportunities to reach out.

COURT DATE NOTIFICATION

NOTICE AFTER NON-APPEARANCE

People miss court for many reasons. Reaching out after someone misses a court date may result in quick rescheduling without further consequences.

REMINDER BEFORE REVOCATION

Some states send letters after a missed appearance notifying a person that their driver's license will be revoked and instructing them how to address the issue. Additional outreach, like a phone call or text, can help.

RELIEF CONFIRMATION

If your court provides relief to people with revoked licenses, such as through a license restoration clinic, provide confirmation of that relief so someone knows they are eligible to reinstate their license.
